Mission Column: Be Strong through the Grace that God gives You in Christ Jesus

Grace is a foundational truth in Christian faith. The life of establishing the Kingdom of God on this earth is completely based on God's grace. To the extent that we know and experience God's grace, we can participate in God's work of establishing the Kingdom of God on this earth. Then, what is God's grace that we should know and experience throughout our lives?

When we say that the highest definition of God in the Bible is love, grace is our experience of this God who is love. In other words, the love of God experienced is called "grace." The Bible tells us that God's love has been revealed to us through Christ Jesus. The Apostle John says that Jesus, who took on our bodies and came to earth as one of us, is full of grace and truth. The hallmark of Jesus' life during the three and a half years of His ministry was that He relied on the Holy Spirit to hear and speak what the Father said, and to see and do what the Father did. The climax of Jesus' life, which went to the cross to become Christ, was also so that we could receive God's life through faith in Jesus as the Christ whom God had promised.

Thus, the important truth of the New Testament is that Christ Jesus in us is the new life of believers, and in this life we live a life in which we conquer and rule over all things by grace. Here, there is a division between the legalistic religion, which is for God through human zeal and effort, and the life of grace, which lives out Christ through faith in the truth. This contrast between law vs. grace, religion vs. Christ, is an all-important junction in the believer's lifelong journey of discipleship. Law and religion demand, judge, and condemn. But the grace of Christ provides, discerns, and restores. When God's Reality As Christ Embodied is poured out upon the Church as a revelation of grace, the Church will serve all the nations as a community of grace with the truth of the Gospel.

The Apostle Paul's exhortation to Timothy, his son of faith, at the end of his life, "Be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus," is an essential truth that we are to re-present the life of the Kingdom of God that Jesus lived in our bodies, here and now, in our assigned place in our lives. The grace of God is in Christ Jesus. When we enjoy this grace and are deeply rooted in it, we can live the life of the Kingdom of God, which overcomes and governs all things in life because of this grace. The multiplication of the four generations, from Paul to Timothy, from Timothy to the faithful ones, and from the faithful ones to the others, is a divine strategy for building the Kingdom of God on earth as designed by God, and it can be accomplished through a life of God's grace.

In the new year of 2024, I hope that we will all become strong in this grace and be disciples making disciples more vigorously everywhere.

We care for their spiritual, physical, and mental needs. Along with that, our priority is to reach non-believers as many as possible.

We are trying to conduct many engaging events and programs such as anniversary, picnic and Christmas targeting non-Christians. Sometimes, it is costly but worth it for the kingdom of God. Somehow, by the grace of God, it has become easier for us to invite new people through these students. We had more than 150 people joined this last Christmas celebration, where half of them were non-believers. We have been planting the seeds in a hope that God will grow them in his time. We are praying and have faith that we will witness at least 10 conversions and baptisms this 2024.

As a multicultural city, Canada itself has become a missionary. What a privilege that God is bringing more and more people to our doors. May God make our churches bold and strong to evangelize, may he make the ways for us to reach and preach with His zeal.

Zimbabwe Church (Church 21) Shingi & Pastor Stephen Suluma

Shingi is thankful to God for showing them a series of amazing miracles during the rehabilitation of Stephen after collapsing from a cerebral hemorrhage in December 2019. Contrary to what the doctor said, he gradually became able to speak, say new words every day, make breakfast, and do laundry. He can pedal a bicycle and even work on the computer. They no longer attend Church 21, which they planted in Toronto. He was let go as the pastor while recovering from the stroke, so now they attend a different Zimbabwe church. Please pray for:

2. Stephen to be able to do more things independently (Shingi is taking her children to school and working at the same time)
3. Shingi—Please continue to give her strength and good health so that she can take care of her family.
4. Daughter Tiara—For the Lord's provision and wisdom during her second year at York University.

Arab Church (Mississauga Life Church) Pastor Hongjong Lee

After 3 years of ministry in Lebanon, Pastor Hongjong planted an Arabic church in Brampton, and it's been 2 years since then. The church was moved to Mississauga a year ago due to the movement of refugees. Please pray for:

4. Even when the fruits of the ministry are not immediately visible, do not become discouraged because of the believers in difficult circumstances, but instead hope that the ministry will be filled with joy and power.

A Short Reflection on NEW LIFE FESTIVAL 2023

On October 28th, 2023, my Canadian mentor Terry Barker and I attended the “New Life Festival” hosted at Vaughan Community Church by Canada Mosaic Christian Alliance (CMCA). It was a great experience for me to worship our God with brothers and sisters from different nations. I believe that it was a very festive event in the Christian community across Canada.

This was my third time attending it. I first heard about CMCA through the previous director, Rev. John H. Chung, but my involvement in it was not until I got to know Rev. Lordwin Lim and his team in the summer of 2018 when I was invited to participate in a small church planting ministry, which was mainly reaching out to the Persian-speaking group in Markham in his church. Around this time, I became extremely interested in Korean history and its culture, which has helped me make friends with Koreans across the GTA, and a lot of them have become my ministry partners over the years.



In 2021, my employment contract was terminated by my former employer (Christ the King Anglican Network in Canada) due to the outbreak and spread of COVID-19. So, I hereafter would have to start looking for a Church community where I could serve the Lord, and two options came up: one was to go back to work with Toronto Chinese Baptist Church (TCBC), where I had been worshipping for four years and did my internship for one year in 2014; the other option was to work with Rev. Lim to plant a small church in North York. After praying and discerning about the guidance of the Lord, I eventually decided to join the Rev. Lim’s team, and was encouraged by him to reach out to international students in North York. Ever since then, I have been running an ESL program to reach out to new immigrants as well as international students there. Later on, I also decided to work with Rev. Lim to minister to the refugees at Adam House in North York as a volunteer.

The relevance of the above narrative to this reflection on the “New Life Festival 2023” event is that one of the inspirations I got during my ministry involvement decision-making process was that I saw the vision of CMCA being posted on the website. As I did some research on CMCA, two Scripture verses stood out for me: “After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. And they cried out in a loud voice: ‘Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb (Revelation 7:9-10).” Thinking about these verses in 2010, I had got a sense of calling to the ministry earlier. Ever since then, I have been challenged to decide whether to focus upon Chinese communities, or on others outside my own cultural circle for my ministry.

In this challenge in 2021, when I actually could have chosen to go to work with TCBC, where the financial support could be more secure, and culturally the group to be ministering I would have felt much more comfortable working with. However, after years of getting involved in multicultural ministries, I was encouraged to believe that I have been called to the multicultural-focused ministry instead of focusing on a mono-cultural ministry only. Eventually, I decided to join the ministry that is under the leadership of Rev.Lim. Thus, attending the annual life festival has been a reminder of my calling, and an encouragement to me to do the multicultural church planting ministry at A Quiet Place in North York.

What is more, it has been encouraging seeing this multicultural vision being partially fulfilled in front of my eyes seeing the multitudes of nations coming together to worship God at this festival. During the course of a three-hour worship service, I got a chance to read a little about the history of Vaughn Community Church. Surprisingly, the church was planted in 1966, when the Chinese Cultural Revolution had just broken out. Considering the growth of the Vaughn church community which has blessed countless people over the past half century, whereas, the Cultural Revolution brought trauma to tens of thousands of Chinese. Thus, I have come to be convinced that God's Kingdom is bigger than any visions and dreams of any national leaders within their own nations. History has told us that the empires came and went, but God's Kingdom stays forever.

By working with other cultural groups, including Koreans, I have been challenged to think that God's Kingdom includes all the nations across the world. In my experience, I have travelled to Ethiopia and Thailand to work, and have learned something of their languages and cultures. When I heard the preachers from those countries in this festival greet us using their mother tongues, I was brought back to think of my time in their home countries. Now, I can see very well that we are all developing our commitment to the multicultural ministry: expansion of God's kingdom to all nations. In addition, I can see that we are all connected with each other one way or another, but most importantly, what has connected us profoundly is through our faith in the same Lord-Jesus Christ and the Kingdom of God.

Praise to the Lord.

May God continue to use the effort of the staff from CMCA to bless more and more people and remember their labouring work.

Gospel Conversation Training

The first **Gospel Conversations Training** in 2024 will begin at 2 o'clock on Saturday, February 10th. This is the third training session at Yonge Centre Plus for BLESS OUTREACH, which involves door knocking in the neighborhood to share the Good News.

Since 2020, we have been visiting neighbors in the Yonge/16th area every Saturday and have shared God's Story. In an effort to expand the outreach, we started the training as a six-week course at Yonge Centre Plus, operated by Youngnak Church near Yonge/Finch from February in 2023.

Every Saturday from 2 - 4 p.m., students practice in class for four weeks, and then go outreach to the neighborhoods for the following two weeks. Even when there is no training session, we continue to gather at Yonge Centre Plus at the same time every week to go outreach teams of two.

When we have more trained people, there will be two people who live in the same neighborhood to go outreach together regularly.

The training is in English and is open for all Christians who want to share the Good News with their neighbors.

Gospel Conversations Training in Toronto College of Evangelism



Since October 24th, Toronto College of Evangelism (Dean: Pastor Woong-Hee Park) has held five sessions of Gospel Conversations Training and Kingdom Life Training along with 4 weeks of practical outreach. Toronto College of Evangelism is an organization where Korean pastors and dedicated believers in the Greater Toronto Area pray and evangelize with the whole city of Toronto, and organizes the annual Jesus in the City Parade and the National Prayer Meeting for Canada. Beginning with the training of telling the story of God in the Bible in three circles in a short period of time with the Gospel, the five-week course begins with "The Heart of God the Father," which is based on "God's Vision from Genesis to Revelation," and "Christ's Great Commission-4 Commands of Christ the King, 1 Conclusion of King's Gospel-1 Covenantal Promise of the King" in Matthew 28:18-20. We have shared various tools for vision casting based on 2 Corinthians 5:17-21 and other verses in the Bible.

Above all, it introduced Jesus' Prayer and the One-Verse Prayer (Hagah) as tools for strengthening in grace, which is the foundation of the life of the Kingdom of God, and introduced a strategic map to achieve the Kingdom of God by visualizing the characteristics of the life of the Kingdom of God completed in the life of Jesus' public life in 4 fields, 1 foundation, and 1 focus. Bless Outreach to search for Person of Peace: Care-Prayer-Share, My Story (15-Second Testimony), and God's Story (3-Minute Gospel Conversations, 411 Training, Discovery Bible Study, etc.) were introduced and practiced together. In addition, we introduced how to raise up and build up a person of peace whom God has allowed us to meet through the Bible so that we can start a small church in our lives, how to easily start an ecclesia, the 5 signs of a healthy church, the "Church Circle" and "Iron On Iron" to identify the church, and the tools of generation mapping to check how many generations of discipleship occur.

After the lecture, we worked as teams to go door-to-door with our neighbors in the Thornhill area, caring for the community, blessing the locals, and sharing God's stories, including the testimonies and Gospel we had been trained. In addition to street evangelism where each team handed out tracts, they were able to share valuable experiences in their neighborhoods to share the Gospel through storytelling, overcoming language barriers. In the last week, we were able to share the Gospel with students from Nepal and young adults who had just come from Iran by singing Christmas songs and distributing evangelistic items at the crossroads of Yonge and Finch area.

In addition to the Multi-Ethnic Mission Team-Bless Outreach, which continues every Saturday at 2 p.m. in the Young/Finch neighborhood, we look forward to continuing the practice of visiting neighbors in the Thornhill area and in the neighborhoods of all trained people, caring for them, praying, and sharing the Gospel. On the one hand, we shared the desire to implement the Bless Every Home movement introduced in the lecture in Canada, and Elder Huh's couple decided to provide financial support for the needs of launching the movement. We hope that Christians will practice care, prayer, and sharing the Gospel to bless their neighbors in every neighborhood across Canada, so that there will be a revival of the Gospel in every city and neighborhood in Canada.

Taking the Classes of CMCA & TIM Centre's MOSAIC MINISTRY Diploma & Certificate Program

I've pondered all summer last year that it is time to study something. Then, as if by chance, my husband introduced me to this course, and without thinking twice, I decided, "This is it." As I attended the first semester of the Mosaic Urban Missionary and Local Church Mission Leader Training Course offered jointly by CMCA and Tyndale, I came to realize that my introduction to the course not a coincidence, but kairós - God's time for me.

The 'Life As Mission Basic' class with ministers Hyunmin Hong and Lordwin Lim laid the foundation for my missional life. It convicted me for never fathoming the biblical meaning of the word 'Mission' despite hearing and using it daily. The class also supported me in finding answers to key missional questions, such as who I am, where I am, what I am for, and what I need to do. One of the things I personally benefited from was the concept of the 'Missional basis of the Bible', which implies that the basis for mission lies not in just a few verses of Scripture, but that it is actually the center of the biblical story. Learning that God's plan to restore the whole world is the central message of the Bible opened my eyes to see the Bible anew. As I studied Christopher Wright's book: *The Mission of God's People* with my professor for one chapter every week, I felt like I was following the author through a cave full of mysteries. I was thrilled to discover that God's mission plan was hidden everywhere - all the way from Genesis to Revelation.

The 'Kairós & Mission Planting' class with minister Gyoojun Lee helped me form a foundational biblical worldview based on God's mission. He offered practical guidance that could enable each and every one of God's members, and the whole church, to meaningfully participate in God's mission. The class provided a variety of mission information, resources, and inspirational videos, which were empowering and dynamic. In addition, activities such as prayer training, devotion training, group meetings, and reading sharing were realistic and very beneficial.

The mere fact that there are more than 280 ethnic groups in Toronto makes me think that all Christians living in Toronto are already in the field of missional life. In the book of Jonah, the greatest stumbling block to the mission was not the sailors, the big fish, the king, nor the people of Nineveh, but Jonah himself. Jonah's sin was that he was a missionary, but did not possess a missionary's heart in him. Like Jonah, I had the image of a Christian who longs for the benefits and blessings of the chosen one, but refuses to take on the responsibility. The following verse therefore sounded like a wake-up call to me.

*And Jonah stalked
to his shaded seat
and waited for God
to come around
to his way of thinking.
And God is still waiting
for a host of Jonahs
in their comfortable houses
to come around
to his way of loving.*

(Excerpt from Thomas Carlyle's poem 'You! Jonah!')

The God of Jerusalem is also the God of Nineveh and the God who loves all the cities, including Toronto, Mississauga, and London. As I await the next semester, I pray that to love this city with the heart of the Lord, and to be a stepping stone rather than a stumbling block for Missions.

2023 Christmas Party with Our Muslim Friends



<Friendship First> is a six-week mission training course to befriend and share the Gospel with Muslims who have come close to us. CMCA conducts mission schools for local churches to help Christians reach out to Muslims, befriend them, and share Jesus Christ with them. Every Saturday morning at 8 o' clock, the Prayer Group of "For the One Of the Least" of Friendship First Fellowship has been praying for seven years for missional work among Muslims, centered on those who have received this training.

In fact, no one in our day is as close to God's salvation as authentic Muslims. This is because they fear God and long for God's salvation. If we Christians can be good friends and neighbors and break through the barriers between Muslims and Christians and share the Gospel of Jesus Christ, many Muslims will come to the Lord. In addition to the prayer meeting for the missions to Muslims every Saturday morning, we continue to hold a Christmas party every December to invite our Muslim neighbors, friends, and co-workers to share the meaning of Christmas and fellowship during the Christmas season.

In 2023, 17 families (15 Muslim families, 1 converted Afghan family, and 1 converted Iranian family) and 48 people from Syria, Turkey, Saudi Arabia, Afghanistan, Iran, Nigeria, and other countries responded to the invitation together, and were able to have abundant fellowship and sharing with the support of committed believers and local churches. After sing-along and a mime, titled "redemption," by Branches Ministry, musical performances and solo, "O Holy Night!" the meaning of the whole Christmas story was introduced through the Bible, followed by a dinner and a bingo game to share Christmas gifts and prizes with each family and children.

To this end, we would like to thank all the staff who have served to the best of their ability, such as donating supplies, donating money, preparing food, preparing programs, decorating the place and volunteering for rides, as well as the graduates of the first class of the CMC Urban Mission Certificate Program, and many local churches and believers.
